

ORDINANCE NUMBER 1

An Ordinance providing for the Granting of Licenses
for the Sale of Spirituous Liquors within
the Town of Redmond.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Town of Redmond that
the annual license fee for the sale of spirituous, fermented,
malt or other intoxicating liquors shall be the sum of ~~Five~~
Hundred Dollars. That no application for such a
license shall be granted to any applicant until a bond in the
sum of One Thousand Dollars shall be furnished by said appli-
cant, conditioned that he shall keep an orderly house and will
not sell liquor to minors. In the event that the holder of any
license shall be ^{as found to be} found guilty by any court of selling liquors
to minors, or of conducting a disorderly house, or of any other
offenses against the state law or any ordinances of the City
of Redmond regulating the conduct of saloons, then and in that
event the license theretofore granted to said party shall be
cancelled and forfeited and all moneys paid on account thereof,
including the amount paid for the unexpired time covered by
said license rights, shall be forfeited to the Town of Redmond and shall
be by it retained. ~~No such license shall be granted to any party
heretofore or who shall hereafter be convicted of selling liquors
to minors, or of conducting disorderly houses, or of any other
offenses against the liquor laws of the State of Washington.~~
All such licenses so granted must be by ordinance.
