

RESOLUTION NO. 105

WHEREAS, a petition has been filed with the Town Council and has been duly certified by the Town Clerk to contain signatures of electors of the Town of Redmond in number equal to, and exceeding, one-fifth of the total vote cast at the last municipal election of the Town of Redmond, said petition being entitled as follows:

"PETITION"

"WE, THE UNDERSIGNED, being residents and qualified electors of the Town of Redmond, King County, Washington, do hereby petition the Town Council of the Town of Redmond to take the necessary steps and procedures and to cause an election to be held in order that the classification of the Town of Redmond may be advanced from a municipal corporation of the fourth class to a third class city, and that the Town of Redmond be re-incorporated and reorganized as the City of Redmond, a third class city, under the general laws of the State of Washington."

and the Town Council is satisfied that the same is a proper and sufficient petition seeking advancement of the Town of Redmond to a higher class, to wit: a third class city; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council has caused a census to be taken by one or more suitable persons of all of the inhabitants of the Town of Redmond, in which census the full name of each person has been plainly written, and the names have been alphabetically arranged and regularly numbered in complete series; and

WHEREAS, said census has been duly verified and filed with the Town Clerk and contains an enumeration of 1524 inhabitants, and the Town Council therefore deems that said census shows that the Town of Redmond belongs to the class named in the petition, to wit: a third class city, and an election should be held to present the question of advancement to the voters at the earliest possible date, Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED that the Auditor of King County, State of Washington, as ex officio supervisor of elections, is hereby requested to cause a special election to be held within the Town of Redmond at the earliest possible date, upon the question to be submitted to the voters of said Town of Redmond of whether they are for or against advancement of the Town of Redmond from a town of the fourth class to a city of the third class, in accordance with the laws of the State of Washington, and to give such notice as is required by law;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor of the Town of Redmond give such notice of said special election as may be required or provided by law.
