ORDINANCE NO. 12

An Ordinance regulating the traffic in intoxicating and Malt Liquors in the Town of Redmond, and providing penalties for the violation thereof..

PETITION..

No license for the sale of intoxicating liquors shall be granted, except upon a petition in writing, which petition shall set forth the name of the party applying for said license, a description of the premises where said business is to be carried on, whether the applicant is the owner or lessee of the premises, and if a lessee the term of his lease and the name of the owner of the premises, and in case the applicant is not the owner of the premises where said license is petitioned for said petition shall have attached thereto the consent in writing of the lessor.. Said petition shall be accompanied by a bond executed in accordance with the provisions of Ordinance No. 11 of the Town of Redmond.. Upon the filing of such a petition the same shall be referred by the Mayor to the License Committee, and no license shall be granted at the same meeting of the Council at which the petition is first presented..

TRANSFER OF LICENSE.. AND CHANGE OF LOCATION..

No license granted by the Town of Redmond shall be transferred, except upon the written petition of the holder thereof which petition shall be in the same form and shall contain all the information required of a petition for an original license, and said petition shall be accompanied by a bond of the proposed transferee and the said petition shall be considered in the same manner as an original petition. No change of location of a saloon license shall be granted, except upon a like petition considered in the same manner.

SALE OF LIQUORS..

It shall be unlawful for any person to sell, give away or dispose of intoxicating liquors within the Town of Redmond without being licensed so to do by said town, and it shall be unlawful for the holder of any license to sell, give away or dispose of intoxicating liquors at any place within said town, except within the room for which said license is granted.. Nothing in the Ordinance contained shall be construed to prohibit druggists from disposing of intoxicating liquors in good faith, upon the written prescription of a reputable physician.

POSTING A LICENSE..

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation licensed to sell liquors, under the provision

of this ordinance to sell such liquors, without having conspicuously posted, in the room designated in said license as the place where intoxicating liquors may be sold, at all times during the term of said license his original license granted by the Town of Redmond.

PERSONS

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation licensed to sell intoxicating liquors to allow or permit any minor or any female, or any intoxicated person, common drunkard, Indian, vagrant, mendicant or habitual drunkard to loiter in or about any place where intoxicating liquors are licensed to be sold, or to sell, give away or dispose of intoxicating or malt liquors to any such person.

CLOSING.

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation licensed to sell intoxicating liquors in the Town of Redmond to give away, sell or dispose of any intoxicating liquors on the day of any general or special election held within the Town of Redmond between the hours of the opening and closing of the polls at said election; or to so give away, sell or dispose of any intoxicating liquors on Sunday, said day being defined as from midnight Saturday night to midnight Sunday night; ~~or to give away, sell or dispose of any intoxicating liquors on any other day between the hours of 12:00 P. M. and 6:00 A. M.~~

PERMITTING GAMBLING IN SALOONS

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation having a license for the sale of intoxicating liquors to conduct any gambling, or to allow or permit any gambling to be conducted in any room where intoxicating liquors are licensed to be sold.

SALOON FRONTS.

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation having a license for the sale of liquors within the Town of Redmond to sell, give away or dispose of such liquors in any room except in a room where the front thereof shall be glass, from a point five feet above the sidewalk on the outside to a point eight feet above the sidewalk on the outside. Said glass above described to be clear glass, and nothing to be placed upon said glass or within the saloon room to obstruct a full view of the whole interior of said saloon by any person

looking through said glass from the exterior. Provisions of these sections shall not be construed to prevent necessary window casings, door casings and other supports for the holding of the said glass.

AGENTS AND EMPLOYEES

It shall be unlawful for any person whether by himself or by any agent or employee, or as the agent or employee of another person to do or commit any of the acts prohibited under the terms of this ordinance; and proof of the committing of any of the acts herein prohibited by an agent shall be proof of a commission of said acts by his employer.

PENALTY

Any person violating or failing to comply with any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine in a sum not exceeding Fifty Dollars, and upon a second conviction for violations of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not less than Fifty Dollars and not exceeding One Hundred Dollars; and upon a third conviction by a fine of One Hundred Dollars or by a fine of One Hundred Dollars and imprisonment in the city jail not exceeding thirty days.
