

RESOLUTION NO. 170

A RESOLUTION, relating to the control of dogs running at large; and requesting the King County Auditor to call a special election of the voters of the City of Redmond, Washington, on the question of a "Dog Leash Law."

WHEREAS, the City Council has received a petition signed by residents of the City requesting that an ordinance be adopted to control the running at large of dogs within the City of Redmond except when under the immediate control of the owners thereof; and

WHEREAS, the City Council deems it advisable to refer the matter to a vote of the registered voters of the City of Redmond at a special election held within the City for such purposes; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that an emergency exists requiring a special election and that such election should be held at the same time and in conjunction with the State general election on November 8, 1966; Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON, as follows:

Section 1. That the Auditor of King County, Washington, be authorized and requested to call a special election within the City of Redmond at the same time and in conjunction with the State general election on November 8, 1966, upon the proposition of whether the City Council of the City of Redmond, Washington should adopt an ordinance prohibiting dogs from running at large within the City of Redmond.

Section 2. That the following proposition be submitted to the registered voters of the City at such special election;

PROPOSITION NO. III

"ADOPTION OF DOG LEASH LAW"

"Shall the City Council of the City of Redmond, Washington, adopt an ordinance to prohibit dogs from running at large within the City of Redmond: "at large" to mean off the premises of the owner while not under the immediate control of the owner or his agent by leash, cord, chain or other restraint?"

FOR DOG LEASH LAW

AGAINST DOG LEASH LAW

Section 3. That the City Attorney is hereby authorized and empowered to make changes in the wording of the above proposition and ballot title should such changes be found necessary or appropriate, so long as the essential purpose thereof is met.


Section 4. That an emergency is hereby found to exist, requiring that the above proposition be placed before the registered voters at a special election hereby called for such purposes; and the King County Auditor is hereby requested to concur in such emergency hereby found to exist.

Section 5. That the expenses of such special election shall be borne and paid by the City of Redmond as provided by law.

Section 6. That this Resolution shall take effect immediately.


