RESOLUTION NO. 173

A RESOLUTION relating to highways and endorsing the 1967-69 Biennium Priority Schedule prepared by the King County-City Coordinating Conference for the construction and modernization of highways in the King County area.

WHEREAS, the recently formed King County-City Coordinating Conference of which Redmond is a member, through its Engineers and Planners Subcommittee, has recommended a 1967-69 Biennium Priority Schedule for State Highways in King County which will best serve the anticipated and immediate needs of the area in order to meet the increasing demands of the population influx and the extensive growth and development now taking place within King County; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has examined the recommended Priority Schedule for State Highways and finds it to be in the best interests of the City and King County as a whole that the same be implemented as soon as possible to relieve traffic congestion problems now prevalent in many areas and to provide for the development of a well planned, modern highway system which will best serve the present and future highway needs of the area; Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Redmond that the 1967-69 Biennium Priority Schedule prepared by the King County-City Coordinating Conference for the construction and modernization of State highways is hereby endorsed and recommended, and the Washington State Highway Commission is petitioned and urged to grant every consideration to the early implementation and completion of the recommended schedule in order that the critical traffic problems in this area may be alleviated and corrected.
