AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF  
REDMOND, WASHINGTON AMENDING  
PAY PLAN A

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WHEREAS, the City of Redmond agreed through collective bargaining processes to grant across-the-board increases in pay for 1994 to City maintenance workers, mechanics, and technicians represented by the Washington State Council of County and City Employees, Local 21-RD (AFSCME); and

WHEREAS, these increases should be reflected by amending Pay Plan A; now, therefore


THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON, DO  
ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. "Pay Plan A - AFSCME", representing the Parks and Public Works maintenance workers, mechanics, and technicians is hereby amended, granting a 2.7% across-the-board increase in 1994 pay rates over rates of pay in effect 31 December 1993, as adopted by Ordinance 1712 as set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated by this reference as if set forth in full.


Section 2. The changes to Pay Plan A set forth shall be effective 1 January 1994.

Section 3. This ordinance, being an administrative action, is not subject to referendum and shall take effect five days after its publication, or publication of a summary thereof, in the City's official newspaper.


