

ORDINANCE NUMBER 25

An Ordinance Regulating The Time For Using City Water For Sprinkling and Irrigating Purposes For Lawns And Gardens In The Town Of Redmond.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF REDMOND AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I.

All residents of the Town of Redmond shall have the privilege of using city water for sprinkling and irrigating lawns and gardens from six o'clock to seven o'clock in the forenoon, and from seven o'clock to eight o'clock in the afternoon, only.

SECTION II.

When the fire bell rings, all sprinkling and irrigating shall cease until fire is under control. During a fire no water shall be used except for necessary domestic purposes only.

SECTION III.

Any person violating or failing to comply with any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not less than Two Dollars and not exceeding Ten Dollars.

Upon and succeeding conviction, the punishment shall be by a fine of not less than Ten Dollars, and not exceeding Twenty-five Dollars.

No water shall be furnished to any person found guilty of violating the provisions of this Ordinance until all fines are paid.
