RESOLUTION NO. 266

A RESOLUTION, accepting the proposal of the City of Bellevue to annex a portion of 148th Avenue Northeast from the City of Bellevue to the City of Redmond.

WHEREAS, a portion of 148th Avenue Northeast forms a contiguous boundary between the cities of Redmond and Bellevue in such a fashion that all of said street is presently within the city limits of the City of Bellevue; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed appropriate and desirable that the common boundary between the two cities be in the centerline of said street and the City of Bellevue by Resolution No. 1789, passed March 22, 1971, has initiated a proposed annexation of one-half of 148th Avenue Northeast to the City of Redmond pursuant to RCW 35.10.217(2); and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Redmond has considered the proposed annexation and believes that the adjustment of city boundaries would be appropriate and within the best interest of the respective cities of Bellevue and Redmond; and finding that there are no qualified voters residing in the area to be annexed and that the annexation may be accomplished by the procedure set forth in RCW 35.10.217(2) (3); Now, Therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND DO RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

1. The City Council of the City of Redmond does hereby declare that it accepts the proposal of the City of Bellevue contained in its Resolution No. 1789, passed March 22, 1971, to annex to the City of Redmond the easterly portion of the right of way of 148th Avenue Northeast now lying within the City of Bellevue, and described as follows:

The west 30.00 feet of section 26, township 25 north, range 5 east, W.M. in King County, Washington, lying north of the south margin of vacated Northeast 18th Place (C. B. Howard Rd.) also that portion of 148th Avenue Northeast lying within sections 14 and 23, township 25 north, range 5 east, W.M.

inasmuch as the territory proposed to be annexed is presently a public right of way and as such is exempt from taxation and possesses no building potential for zoning purposes, the City of Redmond states no terms for the annexation except that the territory, when annexed shall be subject to the jurisdiction and control of the City of Redmond, including without limitation its police powers and zoning control.

2. The City Clerk is hereby directed to send a certified copy of this resolution to the City Clerk of the City of Bellevue and to send a certified copy of this resolution to the King County Boundary Review Board in conjunction with similar action by the City of Bellevue. The City Attorney, in cooperation with officials of the City of Bellevue, is directed to prepare and process the necessary instruments to obtain approval of this annexation proposal by the King County Boundary Review Board in accordance with law.

PASSED by the Council of the City of Redmond, Washington, at a regular meeting thereof, AND APPROVED by the Mayor Pro Tem this 6 day of April, 1971.
