**CITY OF REDMOND
ORDINANCE NO. 2747**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON, AMENDING RMC 4.30.030, HUMAN SERVICES COMMISSION, COMPOSITION, TO ALLOW NONRESIDENTS WHO LIVE IN UNINCORPORATED KING COUNTY ON PROPERTY WITH A REDMOND POSTAL ADDRESS TO SERVE ON THE HUMAN SERVICES COMMISSION

WHEREAS, many individuals who have applied to serve on the commission were not eligible to serve due to narrow composition criteria; and

WHEREAS, human services are regional in nature; and

WHEREAS, individuals accessing and interacting with human services do not just reside within the city limits; and

WHEREAS, expanding the eligibility to include residents outside of city limits allows more flexibility.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Classification. This ordinance is of a general and permanent nature and shall become a part of the City Code.

Section 2. Amendment of Subsection. RMC 4.30.030, Human Services Commission, Composition, is hereby amended to read as follows:

4.30.030 Composition.

(A) The commission shall be composed of seven members. At least five of the appointed commissioners shall be residents of the city while two seats may be filled by nonresidents who live in unincorporated King County on property with a Redmond postal address and/or individuals working in Redmond regardless of their residency. Commissioners shall not hold any other city office or position. At no time shall a member of the commission also work for or serve on the board of directors of a human service agency delivering services to city residents. Members shall represent the general citizenry and have an interest in and commitment to human services.


Section 3. Severability. If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance should be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance.

Section 4. Effective date. This ordinance shall become effective five days after its publication, or publication of a

summary thereof, in the city's official newspaper, or as otherwise provided by law.


