**CITY OF REDMOND  
ORDINANCE NO. 2840**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2773, AS AMENDED BY ORDINANCE NO. 2793 AND 2820 BY MAKING ADJUSTMENTS TO THE CITY'S 2015-2016 BIENNIAL BUDGET, IN EXHIBIT 1

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WHEREAS, the Finance Director has identified the need to make certain revisions to the 2015-2016 biennial City budget; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has reviewed the proposed adjustments to the budget and has determined that they should be made.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Ordinance No. 2773 adopting the 2015-2016 biennial budget, passed by the City Council on December 2, 2014, and as amended by Ordinance No. 2793 and Ordinance No. 2820, is hereby amended to recognize the proceeds and related expenditures from the recognition of the City's Law Enforcement Officer and Firefighter (LEOFF) pension liability, the Microsoft Development Review Agreement, additional staff required to support the continuing building surge in the City, the sale of

real property, an Emergency Management Performance grant and the Commercial Organics Program provided by Waste Management.

Section 2.      Severability.    If any section, sentence, clause, or phrase of this ordinance should be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance.

Section 3.      Effective date.    This ordinance shall become effective five days after its publication, or publication of a summary thereof, in the city's official newspaper, or as otherwise provided by law.


