ORDINANCE ÓΕ THE CITY ΟF AN REDMOND, WASHINGTON, AMENDING RMC CHAPTER 12.06 TO UPDATED "COMPLETE STREETS" AND TO ALIGN THIS CHAPTER OF THE REDMOND THE CITY'S MUNICIPAL CODE WITH TRANSPORTATION MASTER PLAN

WHEREAS, Redmond's vision calls for a community of connected neighborhoods with vibrant Urban Centers; and

WHEREAS, Redmond's adopted Transportation Master Plan incorporates the principles of Complete Streets as a fundamental value, and emphasizes the movement of people, goods and freight through street, light rail, transit, pedestrian and bicycle systems that are safe, complete and fully integrated; and

WHEREAS, the Comprehensive Plan Goals include providing safe and environmentally friendly transportation, as well as emphasizing transportation choices; and

WHEREAS, Comprehensive Plan Framework Policy FW-35 directs the City to provide mobility choices by investing in transportation programs, projects and services that promote a "walkable community," a complete bicycling network and enhance the attractiveness of transit; and

WHEREAS, Comprehensive Plan Transportation Policy TR-4 calls for the City to require that all streets be complete

streets in compliance with the City's design standards and plans, and TR-5 directs the City to meet travel needs of all modes in the transportation network.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Classification. This ordinance is of a general and permanent nature and shall become a part of the City Code.

Section 2. Amendment of Chapter. RMC 12.06, Complete the Streets, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 12.06.010 Complete the Streets. Section 12.06.020 Exceptions.

Section 12.06.030 Implementation.

12.06.010 Complete the Streets

[THE CITY OF REDMOND WILL PLAN FOR, DESIGN AND CONSTRUCT ALL NEW] All transportation projects [TO] shall provide appropriate accommodation for persons of all ages and of all abilities, including bicyclists, pedestrians, transit users, as well as automobiles, freight and [PERSONS OF ALL ABILITIES] buses, in comprehensive and connected networks defined in the City's Transportation Master Plan, provided that such accommodation shall take into account and compliment

the local context and character of the community and land use.

Section 12.06.020 Exceptions

(A) Facilities for bicyclists, pedestrians, transit users, <u>automobiles</u>, <u>freight and buses</u> and/or people of all <u>ages and</u> abilities are not required to be provided:

[(A)] (1) Where their establishment would be contrary to public health and safety or use by specified users is prohibited by law (such as interstate freeway or light rail);

[(B)] (2) Where there is no current or future demand identified for a particular mode [IDENTIFIED LONG TERM NEED]; or

[(C)] <u>(3)</u> Where the Public Works Director grants a documented exception which may only be authorized in specific situations where conditions warrant. Such site-specific exceptions shall not constitute general changes to the standards set in RMC 12.06.010.

Section 12.06.030 Implementation

- The City shall view Complete Streets standards set in RMC 12.06.010 as a part of the everyday transportation decision making process, and implementation of these standards shall be incorporated into relevant City documents, guidelines and procedures when they are created or as they are and updated, including the revised Transportation Master Plan, Standard Details, and relevant design guidance materials. Effort should be made to coordinate projects and facilities with neighboring jurisdictions to provide continuity wherever feasible.
- (B) The City shall measure the success Complete Streets implementation using performance measures identified in the City's Transportation Master Plan, including measures that assess safety, network connectivity and completion, and travel mode share.
- Severability. If any section, sentence, Section 3. clause or phrase of this ordinance should be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity

or constitutionality of any other section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance.

Section 4. Effective date. This ordinance shall become effective five days after its publication, or publication of a summary thereof, in the city's official newspaper, or as otherwise provided by law.
