

1972 Six-Year Urban  
Arterial Construction Program

CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON

RESOLUTION NO. 299

A RESOLUTION, adopting a revised and extended Urban Arterial Construction Program for the ensuing six years based upon a regular review thereof, and providing for revisions and extensions of such program.

WHEREAS, the Public Works Director has made a review and study of the needs of the City for arterial street construction and improvement and has prepared an extended and revised Urban Arterial Construction Program for the ensuing six years pursuant to RCW 35.77.010 and RCW 47.26.220, and has submitted the same to the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Council duly set and held a public hearing on June 20, 1972, at 8:00 P.M., on said proposed Urban Arterial Construction Program; and

WHEREAS, the City Council, having reviewed the work accomplished under the Urban Arterial Construction Program previously adopted by Resolution No. 252 on June 16, 1970, and having determined current arterial street needs in the City, and finding that such program should be revised and extended for the ensuing six years, NOW, THEREFORE,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND DO RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

1. The City Council finds upon a regular review that the six-year Urban Arterial Construction Program for the City of Redmond should be and the same is hereby revised and extended for the ensuing six years to include the urban area arterial street improvements and construction projects as shown on the attached Exhibit A, entitled "Urban Area Six-Year Construction Program," insofar as the same pertains to arterial streets within the City of Redmond. Such program and plan has been based upon estimated revenues available to the City for such construction, together with such additional sums as the City Council may request for urban arterials only from the urban arterial trust account for the six-year period administered by the Urban Arterial Board of the State of Washington, and provides for a more rapid rate of completion of the long-range construction needs of major arterial streets than for secondary and collector arterial streets, pursuant to regulations of the Urban Arterial Board.


2. Annually hereafter, said program shall be reviewed in light of work accomplished and the then urban area arterial street needs. Based upon such findings, the Public Works Director shall prepare a revised and extended Urban Arterial Construction Program for the ensuing six years, to be submitted to the City Council for its adoption after the necessary public hearings have been duly held.

3. Such program may be revised at any time by the majority action of the City Council according to present needs after necessary public hearings thereon have been held.

4. Duplicate copies of the Urban Arterial Construction Program for the ensuing six years shall be filed with the Director of Highways of the State of Washington immediately upon the adoption of said program and any revisions and extensions thereto.
