RESOLUTION NO. 301

A RESOLUTION endorsing the plan of the Municipality of Metropolitan Seattle (METRO) to provide efficient and reasonable transit service to the residents of King County and municipalities.

WHEREAS, the Municipality of Metropolitan Seattle (METRO), together with the Puget Sound Governmental Conference, have heretofore undertaken extensive studies and investigation of the feasibility of providing efficient and reasonable transit service to the residents of King County, including the citizens of municipalities therein; and their consultants, Daniel, Mann, Johnson and Mendenhall, having heretofore prepared and submitted plans, feasibility study and like data; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined and the City Council of the City of Redmond does hereby find that such proposed transit service would be of substantial benefit to the public of King County and especially to the citizens of Redmond who are urgently in need of improved, regular and reasonable transportation, Now, Therefore,


THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND DO RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

1. Metro Transit Plan Endorsed. The City Council of the City of Redmond does hereby find and determine that the proposed "Metro Transit Plan" as heretofore presented, is a proper, reasonable and beneficial Plan to the general public of King County and especially the citizens of Redmond, in providing regular, efficient and inexpensive public transportation. The City of Redmond hereby goes on record in fully endorsing and supporting the principles of the Plan and urges its implementation at the earliest possible date.

2. Copies to be Furnished. Copies of this resolution shall be furnished by the City Clerk to appropriate Metro officials for their use.

PASSED by the Council of the City of Redmond, Washington, at a regular meeting thereof and APPROVED by the Mayor this 1st day of August, 1972.


