

Ordinance No. 32

An Ordinance governing the conduct of pool rooms, billiard rooms, bowling alleys and card rooms within the Town of Redmond, and providing for the licensing thereof.


Be it Ordained by the Town Council of the Town of Redmond:

**Section 1.** It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to open, carry on, maintain or conduct any billiard room, pool room, bowling alley or card room or room for the playing of any other games within the Town of Redmond without first taking out and procuring a license so to do, such license to be known as a billiard and card table license. The fee for any such billiard and card table license shall be the sum of \$50.00 per annum. See #872 — \$100 per year.

**Section 2.** Application for any such license shall be made in writing to the Town Council at its regular meeting and same shall be acted upon at the meeting at which originally presented, but shall go over to the next meeting of the Council and notice of such application shall be given by posting three copies thereof in public places within the Town of Redmond so that any persons interested may appear before the Council to object to the granting of any such license.

**Section 3.** Any such billiard or card room shall at all times be conducted in an orderly manner and minors shall not be allowed therein; and in the event of the failure of any proprietor thereof to conduct the same in such orderly manner as herein provided for, the Council may in its discretion cancel such license, in which event the unearned portion thereof shall be forfeited to the Town of Redmond.

**Section 4.** Any such license may upon application to the Council and upon their approval thereof, be transferred to



a new holder, but nothing shall prevent the Council from refusing such a transfer.

Section 5. Any person so conducting a billiard, pool, card or bowling room without obtaining such license shall be guilty of misdemeanor and shall be subject to a fine of not to exceed \$50.00.
