

ORDINANCE #33.

An Ordinance Prohibiting Cattle And Hogs, Sheep And Goats From Running At Large, Providing For The Impounding Of Any Such Animals So Found Running At Large And For The Sale Thereof.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF REDMOND AS FOLLOWS:

FIRST: IT SHALL BE UNLAWFUL for any person or corporation to permit any cattle, hogs, sheep or goats to run at large within the limits of the Town of Redmond.

SECOND: Any cattle, hogs, sheep or goats so found running at large shall be impounded by the Marshall or by any person appointed by him or by the Mayor to so impound such animals.

THIRD: Upon any person establishing his ownership or right to possession of such animals so impounded the same shall be delivered to him upon the payment of an impounding fee of Two Dollars (\$2.00) per animal and Fifty Cents (50¢) for each day or part of a day such animals shall have been so detained for the care and feeding thereof, and it shall be the duty of the officer impounding the same to attend to such proper care and feedi:

FOURTH: If at the expiration of two days any impounded animal should not be released by the owner by the payment of the costs and fees herein provided for, the person impounding the same shall proceed to give ten days notice by posting in three prominent places in the Town of Redmond of a time and place where he will expose the said animal or animals for sale at public auction, at which time and place he shall proceed to sell said animals at public auction and out of the proceeds shall pay all of the expenses of keeping and shall pay the residue to the City Treasurer. At any time within six months thereafter the former owner upon satisfactory proof to the City Treasurer of his ownership of said animal or animals may receive the residue of the proceeds of the sale, but if said proceeds shall not have been claimed within said six months the City Treasurer shall pay said residue into the general fund.
