ORDINANCE # 341

An Ordinance Providing For The Killing Of Vicious Dogs.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF REDMOND.

First:-Whenever any dog shall be found chasing, attacking, biting, injuring or killing any sheep, swine, dog or other domestic animal outside of the enclosure of the owner of such dog, or shall be found chasing, attacking, biting or injuring any child or person, is hereby declared to be a nuisance, and the marshall may in his discretion, if it seem necessary, kill said dog, or he or any other person may report the facts to the City Council. Upon such a report being made to the City Council, it shall make such inquiry into the facts as seems necessary and may declare such dog a nuisance. Upon declaring such dog a nuisance, it shall cause the owner to be notified to keep such dog in leash or confined upon his premises. If thereafter the dog be found at large, it shall be the duty of the marshall to kill it.

Second:-This Ordinance shall not be taken as limiting or in any wise qualifying the provisions of the statutes of the State of Washington providing for the killing of vicious dogs.
