RESOLUTION NO. 356

A RESOLUTION, creating and designating the City of Redmond Bicentennial Commission.

WHEREAS, the United States of America has by Presidential proclamation designated 1976 as Bicentennial year for national observance of the 200th year of the anniversary of the American revolution, and

WHEREAS, the Federal government, state governments and local city governments are being encouraged to participate to the fullest degree in this national observance, and

WHEREAS, the City of Redmond has been officially designated a Bicentennial community by the Washington State American Revolution Bicentennial Commission, and

WHEREAS, the City Council recognizes the importance of the observance of this historical event and milestone in our nation's history and that its citizenry should be encouraged to participate to the fullest extent possible, Now, Therefore,


THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND DO RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

1. That the City of Redmond, being an officially designated Bicentennial community, does hereby create and designate the Bicentennial Commission for the purpose of promoting and carrying out the community observance of the 200th anniversary of the American revolution and to make necessary applications for Federal funding of its Bicentennial events or activities.

2. The City of Redmond Bicentennial Commission shall terminate on December 31, 1976.

PASSED by the Council of the City of Redmond, Washington, at a regular meeting thereof, and APPROVED by the Mayor this 3 day of December, 1974.
