RESOLUTION NO. 397

A RESOLUTION, proclaiming the City of Redmond as a "Green Survival City" and encouraging all citizens to participate in this program to enhance the environment.

WHEREAS, the American Association of Nurserymen and its members have developed a "Green Survival" program to enhance the environment and protect and improve the quality of the lives of all citizens, through the planting of trees, shrubs, grass and other plants, in an ecological balance, thereby providing valuable assistance in efforts to purify the air, stabilize the soil, clarify water, abate noise, assist in the stewardship of our energy resources, protect the beauty of our land against visual pollution and contribute to the mental and emotional well being of all persons; and


WHEREAS, the American Revolution Bicentennial Administration has given formal recognition to the Green Survival program as a valued activity for every citizen, and the City of Redmond, as a Bicentennial community, has the opportunity to be designated as a Green Survival City and thus become a part of this important program to preserve and enhance our environment, Now, Therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND DO RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

1. That the City of Redmond be proclaimed as a "Green Survival City" and its citizens be encouraged to give the Green Survival program their enthusiastic and full support in order to preserve and enhance the environment through the planting and maintenance of trees, shrubs, grass and other plants.
2. That the City of Redmond shall endeavor in every way possible to implement and support the Green Survival program in its building and development programs and supervision and control of the growth and development of the physical environment of Redmond.
3. That copies of this Resolution be made available to be submitted as a part of the material necessary to achieve national designation as a Green Survival City and for other similar purposes.
