RESOLUTION NO. 410

A RESOLUTION, establishing priorities for community development programs and projects for block grant funds under the Housing and Community development Act of 1974, Pub. L. 93-383 for 1977-79; and approving project applications for the calendar year 1977.

WHEREAS, King County is an urban county applicant for block grant funds under the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, Pub. L. 93-383, and an Urban County Consortium has been established by interlocal cooperation agreements between the County and certain local municipal corporations within the County to which the City of Redmond is a party; and

WHEREAS, in furtherance of said interlocal cooperation agreements and to qualify for reimbursement of eligible block grant community development programs under the Act, the City Council has duly held public hearings on November 2, 1976 and November 16, 1976, and following such public hearings has established priorities for community development block grant programs and projects within the City of Redmond and has approved the submission of appropriate applications therefor; Now, Therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND DO RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

1. Priorities for Block Grant Community Development Programs established. The following community development programs and projects within the City of Redmond have been identified and will be submitted to King County for allocation and approval for block grant funding in the order of priority established below until the City's Housing and Community Development Fund entitlement has been exhausted; Provided, that in the event any Priority A programs and projects are determined to be ineligible for block grant funds, available funding shall be utilized for the programs and projects next prioritized under Priorities B and C:

PRIORITY A (1977)

(1) Project Contingency	Contingency for projects proposed in 1976 not yet put out for bid.
(2) Community Center and Transportation	Phase II improvements to community center at Anderson Park and continued operation of passenger van. ESTIMATED COST: \$ 3,500
(3) Walkway Construction	(A) Four foot walkways on 171st Avenue N.E. from N.E. 80th Street to N.E. 95th Street ESTIMATED COST: \$12,000  (B) Complete walkway along Redmond Way in vicinity of Cascade Vista Retirement Center. ESTIMATED COST: \$13,900  TOTAL ESTIMATED COST: \$25,900

- (4) Street Improvements Anderson Park street improvements along 168th Avenue N.E. and N.E. 79th St.  
ESTIMATED COST: \$23,000
- (5) Fire Safety Smoke detectors for low and moderate income senior citizens and handicapped persons.  
ESTIMATED COST: \$ 3,000
- (6) Planning and Admin. Project Planning and Administration  
ESTIMATED COST: \$ 2,000
- (7) Elimination of Blight Demolition and landscaping of Old City Shop site.  
ESTIMATED COST: \$ 3,000
- (8) Sewer Service Sewer connections for low income and retired persons to the extent possible.  
ESTIMATED COST: \$10,000

- (1) Storm Drainage Storm drainage study and improvements.
- (2) Community Center Improvements & Transportation Community Center and transportation services.
- (3) Walkway Construction
  - (A) Walkway along N.E. 51st Street, 148th to Bellevue-Redmond Rd.
  - (B) Walkway on Old Redmond Road east of 148th Avenue.
  - (C) Walkway on Woodinville Road from N.E. 116th to N.E. 88th St.
  - (D) Walkway and bridge improvements along Leary Way (joint City-County project).
  - (E) Walkway along west side of Hartman Park from N.E. 100th Street to N.E. 104th Street.

PRIORITY C (1979)

PROGRAM


PROJECT

- (1) Community Center and Transportation Community Center improvements and transportation services.
- (2) Construction of Walkways and Pedestrian Improvements
  - (A) Walkway/Bikeway along Avondale Road from N.E. 95th St. to City Center (joint City-County project).
  - (B) Proposed wheel chair ramps in central business district.
  - (C) Walkway on N.E. 95th Street West of 166th Avenue to water res.

2. Applications approved. The submission of appropriate applications and agreements for block grant funding of the community development programs and projects for the City of Redmond, set forth above under Paragraph 1. of this Resolution, is hereby approved.
