RESOLUTION NO. 439

A RESOLUTION, in commemoration of Clarence H. Fullard for his many years of faithful service to the City of Redmond and its citizens; and dedicating and naming the log cabin house at Anderson Park as the "Fullard House" in his memory.

WHEREAS, Clarence H. Fullard, who passed away on July 12, 1977, at the age of 84 years, devoted many years of his life to the unselfish, dedicated and loyal service to the City of Redmond in many of its functions, departments and areas of public service, having served as a charter member, president and officer of volunteer firefighters of the Redmond Fire Department, as a park caretaker and guardsman, as a maintenance man, overseer and general handyman for the Town Hall, City Hall and other municipal buildings, and to the community in many areas of dedicated public service; and

WHEREAS, "Clary" Fullard, as he was affectionately known around the community, first came to Redmond in 1925 to visit a friend, stayed on to become an original member of the town's unofficial fire department in 1932, became park caretaker in 1954 and commenced living in the log cabin house which was built in Anderson Park in 1934, helped organize the Redmond Volunteer Fire Department in 1946 as its first president, and ever since has continuously performed many services for the City and its citizens, having remarked that his heart and soul are in this town; and

WHEREAS, it is fitting and appropriate that this service and dedication of Clary be appropriately remembered and commemorated; Now, Therefore,


THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND DO RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That CLARENCE H. FULLARD be remembered in grateful appreciation of his many years of unselfish and dedicated service to the City of Redmond, the community and its citizens.

Section 2. That the log cabin house in Anderson Park previously occupied and used by Clarence H. Fullard as living quarters in his capacity as park caretaker for some twenty-three years, be named and designated as "FULLARD HOUSE" in commemoration of his many years of faithful and valuable public service rendered by Mr. Fullard.
