RESOLUTION NO. 464

A RESOLUTION, authorizing and approving an application for funding assistance to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation as provided by the Marine Recreation Land Act and state bond funds for a project known as the Farrel-McWhirter Community Park Development.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Redmond, Washington, has approved a "Comprehensive Park and Recreation Plan" for the urban area which identifies a community park in an area fronting Redmond Road and 196th Avenue N.E., Redmond, Washington; and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of the Marine Recreation Land Act and state bonds funds, state and federal funding assistance has been authorized and made available to aid in financing the construction of outdoor recreational facilities of local public bodies; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Redmond, Washington, considers it in the best public interest to develop a community park in the northeastern part of the City generally located at Redmond Road and 196th Avenue N.E., Redmond, Washington, upon a site known as the Farrel-McWhirter Community Park, and to make application for state and federal funding assistance, Now, Therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND DO RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

1. Application for fund assistance be approved. That an application for funding assistance is hereby approved and the Mayor is hereby authorized and empowered to execute the necessary instruments and to make formal application to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation for fund assistance in connection with a project known as the Farrel-McWhirter Community Park Development.


2. Use of fund assistance. That any fund assistance so received be used in the development of approximately 68 acres of land in the northeastern part of the City of Redmond, Washington, generally located at Redmond Road and 196th Avenue N.E., Redmond, Washington, known as the Farrel-McWhirter Community Park site.

3. Property developed to be used as outdoor recreation facility. That any property developed with financial aid through the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation be placed in use as an outdoor recreation facility and be retained in such use in perpetuity unless as otherwise provided and agreed to by the City Council, the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation, and an affected federal agency.


4. Resolution part of formal application. That this resolution become part of a formal application to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation.


