RESOLUTION NO. 484

A RESOLUTION, establishing priorities for community development program and projects for block grant funds under the Housing and Community development Act for 1974, Pub. L. 93-383 for 1979-81; and approving project applications for the calendar year 1979.

WHEREAS, King County is an urban county applicant for block grant funds under the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 Pub. L. 93-383, and an Urban County Consortium has been established by interlocal cooperation agreements between the County and certain local municipal corporations within the County to which the City of Redmond is a party; and

WHEREAS, in furtherance of said interlocal cooperation agreements and to qualify for reimbursement of eligible block grant community development programs under the Act, the City Council duly held a public hearing on August 15, 1978, and following such public hearing has established priorities for community development block grant programs and projects within the City of Redmond and has approved the submissions of appropriate applications therefor; Now, Therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND DO RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:


1. Priorities for Block Grant Community Development Programs established. The following community development programs and projects within the City of Redmond have been identified and will be submitted to King County for allocation and approval for block grant funding in the order of priority established below until the City's Housing and Community Development Fund entitlement has been exhausted; provided, that in the event any higher priority programs and projects are determined to be ineligible for block grant funds, available funding shall be utilized for the programs and projects next prioritized:

<u>Priority No.</u>	<u>Fund Source</u>	<u>Project Title</u>
1	Needs	Housing Rehabilitation
2	Population	Senior Center Renovation (Fullard House)
3	Population	Senior Citizen Transportation Service (lease or purchase passenger van)
4	Population	Walkway Construction (151st Ave. N.E.)
5	Population	Walkway Construction (N.E. 95th St.)
6	Population	Walkway Construction (180th Ave. N.E.)

2. Applications approved. The submission of appropriate applications and agreements for block grant funding of the community development programs and projects for the City of Redmond, set forth above under Paragraph 1 of this Resolution, is hereby approved.

PASSED by the Council of the City of Redmond, Washington, at a regular meeting thereof, and APPROVED by the Mayor this 5th day of December, 1978.


