RESOLUTION NO. 496

A RESOLUTION amending the Three-Year Plan for community development programs and projects for block grant funds under the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, Pub. L. 93-383 for 1979-81.

WHEREAS, King County is an urban county applicant for block grant funds under the Housing and Community Development Act for 1974, Pub. L. 93-383, and an Urban County Consortium has been established by interlocal cooperation agreements between the County and certain local municipal corporations within the County to which the City of Redmond is a party; and

WHEREAS, in furtherance of said interlocal cooperation agreements and to qualify for reimbursement of eligible block grant community development programs under the Act, the City Council duly held a public meeting on March 20, 1979, and following such public meeting, has established priorities for community development block grant programs and projects within the City of Redmond and has approved the submission of appropriate applications therefore as an amendment to Resolution No. 473, previously adopted for such program; Now, Therefore,


THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND DO RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Block Grant Community Development Programs for 1979-81 amended. That certain document entitled, "Three-Year Development Plan 1979-81, City of Redmond, August 1978," which had been approved previously by Resolution No. 473, passed August 22, 1978, and is on file in the City of Redmond Department of Planning and Community Development, is hereby amended as set forth in Attachment A of this Resolution.

Section 2. Applications approved. The submission of appropriate applications and agreements for block grant funding of the community development programs and projects for the City of Redmond, to implement the Plan as amended in Paragraph 1 of this Resolution, is hereby approved.

II. Community Problems and Needs

(new) E. Planning for Low and Moderate Income People

The City needs to increase its ability to plan for and deal with the problems of senior citizens, youth, low and moderate income people and minorities. As the City grows, these groups and their needs will increase, and the City should be in a position to better evaluate needs, problems and solutions.

III. Housing and Community Development Goals, Objectives and Activities and Strategies

Objectives

- (new) 9. Improve the City's ability to plan, evaluate and survey the needs and problems of low and moderate income people, youth, minorities and senior citizens.

Activities/Strategies

- (new) 8. Survey and evaluate the City's housing stock.
(new) 9. Survey the needs for social service programs.
(new) 10. Continue land use and public works facility planning to meet the needs of low and moderate income persons.

IV. Other Programs/Projects Addressing Community Needs

- (new) 5. Planning, regulatory, and policy development funded by the City of Redmond.
(new) 6. Conduct an annual census funded by the City of Redmond.

V. Citizen Participation Plan

- (new) 11. The City will follow these same procedures for amendments to the Three-Year Plan and the reallocation of funds.
