RESOLUTION NO. 514

A RESOLUTION adopting the Three-Year Plan for community development programs and projects for block grant funds under the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, Pub. L. 93-383 for 1980-82; establishing priorities for community development block grant programs and projects within the City of Redmond; and approving project applications for program year 1980.

WHEREAS, King County is an urban county applicant for block grant funds under the Housing and Community Development Act for 1974, Pub. L. 93-383, and an Urban County Consortium has been established by interlocal cooperation agreements between the County and certain local municipal corporations within the County to which the City of Redmond is a party; and

WHEREAS, in furtherance of said interlocal cooperation agreements and to qualify for reimbursement of eligible block grant community development programs under the Act, the City Council duly held a public hearing on November 13, 1979, and following such public hearing, has established priorities for community development block grant programs and projects within the City of Redmond and has approved the submission of appropriate applications there-fore; Now, Therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND DO RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Three-Year Plan for Block Grant Development Programs for 1980-82. That certain document entitled "Three-Year Development Plan 1980-82, City of Redmond, October, 1979," which has been prepared by and is on file in the City of Redmond Department of Planning and Community Development, is hereby adopted as the City's Block Grant Community Development Program and Priorities for 1980-82 for submission to King County for allocation and approval for block grant funding in the order of priority established until the City's Housing and Community Development Fund entitlement has been exhausted, and as may be adjusted administratively by the Director of Planning and Community Development within the limits of the Program.

Section 2. Priorities for Block Grant Community Development Programs. The following community development programs and projects within the City of Redmond have been identified and will be submitted to King County for allocation and approval for block grant funding in the order of priority established below until the City's Housing and Community Development Fund entitlement has been exhausted; provided, that in the event any higher priority programs and projects are determined to be ineligible for block grant funds, available funding shall be reviewed to determine if the funds will be applied to new or existing programs:

- 1. Senior Citizen Transportation:
  - (a) Operation and maintenance of existing van for senior activities in the Park Department \$ 2,500.00
  - (b) Purchase of new van equipped for handicapped, and salary for driver to expand services to the Senior Citizens Club. 20,625.00
- 2. Housing Repair Program:
  - Minor home repair and energy conservation for eligible low-income families as a grant or lien loan (payable upon property transfer or sale). 22,000.00
