WHEREAS, the season of Christmas symbolizes the hope of all mankind for a better tomorrow in all areas of human endeavor and need; and the promise that through a sincere, cooperative and collective effort we may achieve and accomplish a fuller and more meaningful life for all citizens of the world and in particular, the citizens of Redmond, and

WHEREAS, we are reminded, especially through events that have taken place with respect to American hostages imprisoned in Iran, of the need for a commitment of hope and the promise of a peaceful resolution of these kind of concerns through a renewed dedication to the moral principles of mutual trust and understanding as well as establishing accord by meaningful communication directed towards solving the concerns of those involved; and


WHEREAS, we are also reminded of the human needs and concerns of citizens of Redmond which need to be addressed by a city government committed to the principles of hope and promise; and
