

RESOLUTION NO. 571

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON, REJECTING CERTAIN BIDS RECEIVED ON THE BELLEVUE-REDMOND ROAD AT NORTHEAST 40TH STREET TRAFFIC SIGNAL PROJECT NO. 79-ST-90 AND ACCEPTING THE BID OF GENERAL SERVICE ELECTRIC, INC.

WHEREAS, The City of Redmond, Washington, called for bids on the Bellevue-Redmond Road at Northeast 40th Street Traffic Signal Project No. 79-ST-90, Federal Aid Project No. HES-2080(1), and bids on said project were received and opened on November 26, 1980, and

WHEREAS, upon the recommendation of the Director of Public Works, the City Council has determined that the apparent low bid submitted by Signal Electric, Inc., should not be considered and should be rejected due to the failure of the bidder to submit a bid proposal deposit as required, and

WHEREAS, upon the recommendation of the Director of Public Works, the City Council has determined that the apparent second lowest bid submitted by Totem Electric of Tacoma, Inc., should also be rejected for the reason that the bid proposal submitted was incomplete and was not signed by an authorized official of the bidder, and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that the third lowest bid submitted by General Service Electric, Inc., should be accepted, now, therefore,

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The bids submitted on the Bellevue-Redmond Road at Northeast 40th Street Traffic Signal Project No. 79-ST-90, Federal Aid Project No. HES-2080(1) by Signal Electric, Inc., and Totem Electric of Tacoma, Inc., are hereby rejected for the reasons stated above.

Section 2. The bid submitted on Project No. 79-ST-90 by General Service Electric, Inc., in the amount of \$72,126.40 is hereby accepted.
