

RESOLUTION NO. 580

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON, AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 514 CONCERNING THE THREE YEAR PLAN FOR COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS AND PROJECTS FOR BLOCK GRANT FUNDS TO PROVIDE FOR ALLOCATION OF PREVIOUSLY UNALLOCATED FUNDS AND FOR FUNDS ALLOCATED TO A PROGRAM AND/OR PROJECT DETERMINED TO BE INELIGIBLE FOR BLOCK GRANT FUNDING.

WHEREAS, no provision was made in Resolution No. 514 passed by the City Council on November 20, 1979, for disposition of funds which might remain as part of the City's Housing and Community Development Fund entitlement beyond those identified in the list of priorities set forth in Section 2 of said resolution, nor was provision made for allocation of funds designated for a program and project which is determined to be ineligible for Block Grant Funding, now, therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON, DO RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 2 of Resolution No. 514, passed by the City Council of the City of Redmond, Washington, on November 20, 1979, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 2. Priorities for Block Grant Community Development Programs. The following community development programs and projects within the City of Redmond have been identified and will be submitted to King County for allocation and approval for block grant funding in the order of priority established below until the City's Housing and Community Development Fund entitlement has been exhausted; provided, that in the event any program and/or project identified below is determined to be ineligible for block grant funding, the funds allocated to the Housing Repair Program; likewise, all otherwise unallocated funds which are a part of the City's Housing and Community Development Fund entitlement shall be allocated to the Housing Repair Program:

1. Senior Citizen Transportation:
 - a. Operation and maintenance of existing van for senior activities in the Park Department \$ 2,500.00

b.	Purchase of new van equipped for handicapped, and salary for driver to expand services to the Senior Citizens Club.	\$20,625.00
2.	Housing Repair Program: Minor home repair and energy conservation for eligible low-income families as a grant or lien loan (payable upon property transfer or sale).	22,000.00
3.	Coordinated Human Services Program: 1/2 time professional staff member to work with seniors, handicapped, youth and low-income families to coordinate social services programs.	14,000.00
4.	Smoke Detector Installation: Install approximately 200 smoke detectors in the homes of low-income families.	7,000.00
5.	Sewer Connections for low-moderate income families	12,000.00
6.	LW/YES - Youth Advocacy Project: Professional services for low-income youths and families.	19,800.00
