

RESOLUTION NO. 587

A RESOLUTION OF SUPPORT AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE MAYOR TO SUBMIT A PROPOSAL THROUGH KING COUNTY TO THE U.S. ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY FOR FUNDING OF THE IMPLEMENTATION PHASE OF A SOLID WASTE SOURCE SEPARATION PILOT PROGRAM AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE NECESSARY INTERLOCAL AGREEMENTS.

WHEREAS, The City of Redmond expressed interest and was selected as one of two King County cities to participate in a community source separation feasibility study funded by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, and

WHEREAS, after much work and diligence by the Redmond Recycling Committee a report and recommendation has been presented to the Council, and

WHEREAS, the recommendation sets forth a set of goals and policies and a priority list of 9 program components and recommends implementation of a program, and


WHEREAS, the Redmond City Council wishes to express its support for the implementation of a source separation program:

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND:

1. The Council of the City of Redmond approves and supports the report and recommendations of the Redmond Recycling Committee as set forth in a Planning Department Memorandum dated April 23, 1981.
2. The Council of the City of Redmond desires that the City move to implementation of a source separation program as outlined in the above mentioned report; said program may include, but is not limited to the following elements:
 - A. Public Information/Awareness
 - B. Composting
 - C. Neighborhood Collection Centers
 - D. Home Collection Demonstration Project
3. The Council of the City of Redmond desires that the City seek any available EPA funding to help implement a source separation program.
4. The Mayor is authorized to enter into and execute such contracts and Interlocal Agreements as are necessary to implement a source separation program.
