RESOLUTION NO. 664

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY
OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON, IN SUPPORT OF THE
MOVEMENT TO HALT THE NUCLEAR ARMS RACE.

WHEREAS, in response to concerns expressed by citizens of the City of Redmond, the City Council has determined that it is appropriate for the City to express a formal position regarding the danger of continued proliferation of nuclear weapons by various countries throughout the world; now, therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON,
HEREBY RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. To improve national and international security, the United States and the Soviet Union should stop the nuclear arms race. Specifically, they should adopt a mutually verifiable freeze on testing, production and deployment of nuclear weapons and of missiles and new aircraft designed primarily to deliver nuclear weapons. This is an essential, first step toward lessening the risk of nuclear war and reducing existing nuclear arsenals.

Section 2. This resolution shall be communicated by the Mayor of the City of Redmond immediately to the President of the United States and to each member of the delegation of the State of Washington to the U.S. House of Representatives and to each Senator representing the State of Washington in the United States Senate.

Section 3. That funds that would otherwise be spent on nuclear weapons and on the Federal Emergency Management Agency's proposed nuclear civil defense plan be redirected to

human service needs to aid the cities and counties and states of these United States.

Adopted this 20th day of December, 1983 by the City Council, City of Redmond.
