RESOLUTION NO. 678

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON, IN SUPPORT OF THE CONTINUATION OF MARYMOOR MUSEUM AT MARYMOOR PARK IN ORDER TO PROVIDE SERVICES TO THE EASTSIDE COMMUNITY AND TO PRESERVE ITS HERITAGE.

WHEREAS, the long term use of the former Clise home in Marymoor Park as an historical museum is the most appropriate use of this specific site and is in keeping with its historic significance, and

WHEREAS, the Museum has and can continue to demonstrate the interest and ability to interpret the heritage of the historic district of Willowmoor Farm, and

WHEREAS, the Museum is the source of research information and technical assistance to others such as historians, schools, the media and corporations, and

WHEREAS, over the past sixteen years the Museum has provided an historical experience which has become valuable to the Eastside, and

WHEREAS, the City of Redmond has committed itself to the Museum by contracting with the Museum for historical services, and

WHEREAS, the continued growth of the Museum is dependent upon sufficient room made available in the building for the exhibit needs of a viable historical museum, and

WHEREAS, financial support has come from individuals, small local grants and the City of Redmond, which provides a minimal budget and a part-time director, now, therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON, HEREBY RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the King County Council and all concerned parties are hereby urged to recognize the value of Marymoor Museum and commit themselves to the continuation of Marymoor Museum in the Clise Residence at Marymoor Park by contracting with the Museum to provide interpretive service under the Museum's jurisdiction.
