Adopt Recycling Policies

RESOLUTION NO. 786

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
REDMOND, WASHINGTON, ADOPTING A RECYCLING POLICY.

WHEREAS, the City recognizes that recycling and waste reduction is of national, regional and local importance, and that an effective waste management program is essential to protect the health, safety and welfare of City residents, and

WHEREAS, the City desires to select a recycling service provider and to ultimately provide recycling services to City businesses and residents, and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and the Public Works Committee of the City Council have reviewed recycling policies for the City and have recommended that the City Council adopt the policies contained in the document attached hereto as Exhibit A, now therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON,
HEREBY RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City Council adopts the recycling policies as set forth in Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated by this reference as if set forth in full.

RECYCLING POLICIES FOR THE CITY OF REDMOND

The City of Redmond recognizes that recycling and waste reduction is of national, regional, and local importance; and that an effective waste management program is essential to protect the health, safety and welfare of Redmond citizens. In order to pursue these goals on behalf of Redmond's citizens the following policies will guide development of the City's preferred recycling program and will be adhered to when selecting the recycling service provider.

1. The refuse collection franchise with Sno-King disposal will be renegotiated with due consideration to both mandatory and voluntary garbage collection.
2. The City will attempt to use recycled and recyclable material.
3. Non-profit organizations are encouraged to maintain current recycling programs and establish new programs.
4. The recycling program will be designed to cause minimal impact on City resources consistent with efforts to meet recycling goals.
5. The recycling program will be designed to cause minimal financial impact on residents consistent with efforts to meet recycling goals.
6. Recycling participation goals shall be:
 - * 50% monthly participation rate after one year
 - * 65% monthly participation rate after five years
7. Recycling waste stream goals shall be:
 - * 1 year: 30% reduction in waste stream volume
 - * 3 years: 35% reduction in waste stream volume
 - * 5 years: 45% reduction in waste stream volume
8. These materials will be collected for recycling immediately:

9. Special collection items will also be recycled immediately:

10. Other recyclable material will be added to the program as the markets and collection methods are developed by the vendor:
 - * wood (11.2%)
 - * other metals (0.3%)
 - * organics (8.1%)
 - * food waste (8.1%)
 - * textiles (2.9%)
 - * misc. other material (7.9%)
11. The recycling program will serve the following waste generators:
 - * single family and multiple family residences
 - * businesses
 - * institutions: City, schools
12. Many points of collection will be used:
 - * residential curbside
 - * multiple family
 - * commercial
 - * in-house
 - * special collection
 - * drop off
 - * hospital
 - * schools
13. Recyclable material will be source separated and collected in a separate container from garbage.
14. Incentives to recycle will be built in to the negotiated refuse collection franchise contract with Sno-King Disposal.
15. The City encourages King County to install recycling facilities at County transfer stations.
16. An education program that emphasizes the importance of recycling will be provided by the vendor and directed toward consumers.
17. A monitoring and Evaluation system to track and evaluate whether the recycling program is achieving the goals will be provided by the recycler.
