

ORDINANCE NO. 8

An Ordinance regulating the keeping of Horses and Mules, within the Town of Redmond.

Be it ordained by the Council of the Town of Redmond

-1-

It shall be unlawful for any person ~~or Marshal~~ to permit any horse or mule to run at large within the limits of the Town of Redmond..

IMPOUNDING AND FEES.

The Marshal of the Town of Redmond shall detain any horse or mule found running at large in the public pond or any other suitable place which may be chosen by him for the purpose. Said Marshall shall be entitled to charge the owner of any such impounded animal ~~one dollar~~ *one dollar* for each day or part of day it is detained for the care and feeding thereof and shall take means to insure its proper care and feeding, and he shall charge an impounding fee of \$2 for each impounded animal. All such fees to be collected by the Marshal before delivering possession of any impounded animal to the owner thereof.

SALE OF IMPOUNDED ANIMAL.

If at the expiration of 3 days any impounded animal shall not be released by the owners by the payment of costs and fees herein provided, the Town ~~or~~ ~~Marshal~~ shall ~~be~~ given 7 days notice by publication in the official newspaper of the city and by posting a notice in three of the most public places in the Town of a time and place when and where he will expose the said animal for sale ~~at~~ public auction, at which time and place he shall at public auction expose the said animal for sale, and out of the proceeds shall pay all of the expenses of impounding and advertising, and shall pay a residue to the Town Treasurer. Said notice shall describe the said animal with reasonable certainty, and shall state to whom, if any one, the Marshal believes the said animal to belong, and if the name of the owner is unknown, such facts shall be stated in said notice. If such owner be known to the Marshal and he can be found inside of the Town, a copy of such notice shall be served upon him at least one day prior to the sale.

PROCEEDS OF SALE.

At anytime within six months after the date of the sale of any animal the former owner thereof upon application to the Town Treasurer, and upon ~~said~~ proof to such Town Treasurer that he is the former owner may

receive the residue of the proceeds of the sale, after deducting all costs and expenses, but if at the expiration of said six months, the former owner shall ~~have~~ not applied to the Town Treasurer, as provided in this section, then said Town Treasurer shall pay said residue into the current expense fund..

PENALTY..

Any person, firm or corporation knowingly permitting any such horse or mule to run at large, after having been notified by the Marshal to keep ~~the~~ said animal shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not ~~less~~ than \$10..
