AN Ordinance Defining certain Offenses against the Public Peace and Welfare of the Town of Redmond and Fixing the penalty therefor.

BE IT ORDAINED by the town council of the Town of Redmond:-

(1) Disorderly, Indecent or Riotous Conduct:- Whosoever shall be guilty of fighting, drunkenness, or any indecent, riotous or disorderly conduct; or any conduct tending to debauch the public morals or to disturb the peace; or who shall use any profane, abusive or obscene language; or who shall be guilty of any indecent or immoral practice in said town whereby the peace or quiet of said town is, or might be, disturbed, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall pay a fine of not more than One Hundred Dollars or shall be imprisoned in the City Jail not to exceed thirty days, or both.

(2) Weapons:- Whosoever shall within the town of Redmond carry or wear under his clothes or conceal about his person any dangerous or deadly weapon; or who ever shall draw any species of fire arms or any dirk, dagger, knife or other dangerous weapon in the presence of another with intent to intimidate or annoy any person, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall pay a fine of not more than One Hundred Dollars or be imprisoned in the City Jail not to exceed thirty days, or both.

(3) Gambling:- Whoever deals, plays in, wages anything of value on or in any manner conducts or takes part in any gambling game or game of chance for the purpose of winning or securing money by chance, play<sup>ed</sup> with cards, dice or any device, whatever, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by fine of not more than One Hundred Dollars or by imprisonment in the City Jail of not to exceed thirty days, or both.

(4) Vagrancy:- All dissolute women; all prostitutes; all persons who shall solicit any person to visit or enter any house of ill-fame; all persons conducting any such house of ill-fame; all inmates of any such house; all persons who are idle or dissolute or who go about begging; all confidence men; common drunkards; all persons who are habitually neglectful of their employment or their calling and do not lawfully provide for themselves or for the support of their families; all persons who are idlers and dissolute and who habitually misspend their time; all persons lodging in or found in the night time in outhouses, sheds, barns or unoccupied buildings or lodging in the open air and not giving a good account of themselves; all persons who habitually idle their time away where intoxicating liquors are sold or about any saloon without having any visible means of support are hereby declared vagrants and shall be deemed guilty of a Misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not to exceed One Hundred Dollars or imprisoned in the City Jail not to exceed thirty days, or both.

(5) Defacing or Injuring property:- Whoever shall wantonly destroy, deface, write upon or in any manner injure any buildings or other property, public or private, not his own within the Town of Redmond shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not exceeding Fifty Dollars

(6) Resistance of Officer:- Whoever shall wilfully resist any officer or delay any police officer or peace officer of the Town of Redmond in the discharge of any official act or duty, or shall neglect or refuse to obey any lawful order or direction of any such peace officer in the discharge of any lawful act or duty, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in not more than One Hundred Dollars or

imprisoned in the City Jail for not exceeding thirty days, or both.

(7) Police May Demand Aid:- It shall be the duty of every male person over the age of eighteen years within said town of Redmond when called upon by any member of the police force or by the mayor to render prompt aid in making any arrestor enforcing the laws and ordinances of said town, or in preserving the peace and safty of said town; and whoever shall wilfully refuse or neglect to give such aid when so called upon shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not to exceed fifty dollars.

(8) Failure to Pay Fine:- Upon the failure of any party convicted under the provisions of this or any other ordinances of the Town of Redmond to pay any fine levied against him he shall serve out said fine with costs in the City Jail at the rate of three dollars per day. It shall be lawful for the town marshal under the direction of the mayor to work any such prisoner or prisoners upon the public streets of theTown of Redmond during the time of their incarceration.
