## CITY OF REDMOND RESOLUTION NO. 1377

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON, ESTABLISHING A PEDESTRIAN AND BICYCLE ADVISORY COMMITTEE, APPROVING THE PURPOSE OF THE COMMITTEE, AND DEFINING THE MEMBERSHIP AND TERM OF COMMITTEE MEMBERS

WHEREAS, the City of Redmond, as the "Bicycle Capital of the Northwest", recognizes the importance of walking and bicycling to the mobility, sustainability, and efficiency of the transportation system; and

WHEREAS, the City of Redmond is committed to expanding opportunities to walk and bicycle while improving travelers' knowledge, safety, health, and comfort; and

WHEREAS, the City of Redmond values the input of pedestrians, bicyclists, and other local residents and employees as it works to improve conditions for walking and bicycling; and

WHEREAS, the City of Redmond has for many years hosted a monthly meeting of residents and employees, collectively known as the Pedestrian and Bicycle Advisory Committee, who are interested in pedestrian and bicycle-related issues and who have provided valuable feedback to City staff and the Council on the subject of walking and bicycling for transportation in Redmond.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON, HEREBY RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City of Redmond shall continue to host an ongoing series of public meetings as described above, referred to herein as the "Pedestrian and Bicycle Advisory Committee."

Section 2. The purpose of Pedestrian and Bicycle Advisory Committee is to: (1) make recommendations to staff regarding City projects intended to improve bicycling, walking, and other forms of active transportation in Redmond; (2) provide recommendations to staff from a user's perspective on issues related to City construction and planning projects, and any other issues that relate to active transportation users of the and trails within Redmond; (3) streets promote transportation among members of the Redmond community and raise awareness of such plans and projects; and (4) monitor the City's progress as it implements active transportation plans.

Section 3. City of Redmond staff shall work with current Pedestrian and Bicycle Advisory Committee attendees to establish rules of procedure, including policies on attendee roles and the conduct of meetings.
