RESOLUTION NO. 1003

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON, URGING VOTERS TO SIGN PETITIONS IN SUPPORT OF REFERENDUM 48 IN ORDER TO BRING THE PROVISIONS OF THE PRIVATE PROPERTY REGULATORY FAIRNESS ACT, COMMONLY KNOWN AS INITIATIVE 164, TO A PUBLIC VOTE.

WHEREAS, the state legislature enacted the Private Property Regulatory Fairness Act, commonly known as Initiative 164, without subjecting the same to a public vote, and

WHEREAS, Initiative 164 may significantly limit the ability of local governments to make decisions which will govern the use and development of land within their boundaries, and

WHEREAS, a full understanding of land use management and its relation to protecting environmental resources and the quality of life is critical for citizens whose communities are growing and developing at a rapid pace, and

WHEREAS, Referendum 48 will place Initiative 164 on the ballot in November, 1995 and provide an opportunity for full public debate on issues of environmental protection, land development, and private property rights, now, therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON, HEREBY RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Endorsement of Referendum 48. The Redmond City Council hereby urges registered voters to sign Referendum 48 in order to place the Private Property

Regulatory Fairness Act, commonly known as Initiative 164, on the November, 1995 general election ballot. In urging voters to sign the Referendum, the Council's intent is to expose Initiative 164 to full public debate and scrutiny, so that all who may vote on the Initiative, whether for or against, may have the opportunity to be fully informed and to express their opinion.


