A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON, CONDITIONALLY APPROVING ROSE HILL WATER DISTRICT'S COMPREHENSIVE WATER SUPPLY PLAN AS AMENDED BY THE REDMOND TECHNICAL REVIEW COMMITTEE.

WHEREAS, Rose Hill Water District submitted its proposed Comprehensive Water Supply Plan to the City on March 23, 1990, and

WHEREAS, in accordance with RCW 57.16.010, the Redmond City Council has ninety days from the date of submittal to approve, conditionally approve or reject the Rose Hill Water District Comprehensive Water Supply Plan or it will be deemed approved, and

WHEREAS, the Technical Review Committee has reviewed the Plan and recommended to the City Council that the Plan be approved, conditioned upon incorporation of certain amendments to the Plan, now, therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON, HEREBY RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Rose Hill Water District Comprehensive Water Supply Plan, as submitted to the City of Redmond on March 23, 1990, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A, is hereby approved upon the condition that the Plan be amended by the Rose Hill Water District as follows:

- A. Detailed supporting information and data sufficient for the development of storage

requirements within Redmond's corporate limits shall be inserted into the Plan or incorporated in the form of an appendix thereto;

B. The fire flow minimum design standards shall be revised to be consistent with Redmond Fire Department standards as follows:

| 3. | Commercial | 3,500 GPM |
| 4. | Schools and churches | 3,500 GPM |

C. Construction standards for fire protection equipment shall be set by the Redmond Fire Department consistent with those in the corporate limits of Redmond. They are as follows:

1. Hydrant spacing 300 feet maximum from site circle.
2. Hydrants to be equipped with 5" storz quick connect fitting.
3. Redmond underground sprinkling system flushing standards must be used.
4. Redmond's residential sprinkler system standards must be adopted.

D. Twelve inch (12") lines rather than eight inch (8") lines are required as the minimum for commercial development, unless single hydrant supply or specific hydrant hydraulic justification is provided to the Redmond Fire Department.

Section 2. Upon formal amendment of the Rose Hill Water District Comprehensive Water Supply Plan as specified above, the Plan shall be deemed approved.


Dear Bob:
