RESOLUTION NO. 843

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON, AUTHORIZING APPLICATION FOR FUNDING ASSISTANCE FOR AN OUTDOOR RECREATION PROJECT CONSISTING OF A MULTI-USE TRAIL FOLLOWING BEAR CREEK AND EVANS CREEK TO THE INTERAGENCY COMMITTEE FOR OUTDOOR RECREATION AS PROVIDED BY THE MARINE RECREATION LAND ACT.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Redmond has approved a "Comprehensive Park and Recreation Plan" for the urban area which identifies a multi-use trail following Bear and Evans Creeks in the northeastern part of the City, and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of the Marine Recreation Land Act, state and federal funding assistance has been authorized and made available to aid in financing the cost of land for parks and the construction of outdoor recreational facilities of local public bodies, and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Redmond considers it in the best public interest to acquire a multi-use trail following Bear and Evans Creeks in the northeastern part of the City, now, therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON, HEREBY RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized to make formal application to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation for funding assistance in connection with the acquisition of a multi-use trail following Bear and Evans Creeks, in the northeastern part of the City.

Section 2. Any funding assistance received as the result of the application shall be used in the acquisition of sufficient land in the northeastern part of the City of Redmond to develop the multi-use trail identified in the Comprehensive Park and Recreation Plan.

Section 3. The City's share of the project will be derived from Park Bonds.

Section 4. The City of Redmond hereby certifies that the City is responsible to support all non-cash commitments to the local share should they not materialize.

Section 5. Any property acquired with financial aid through the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation shall be placed in use as an outdoor recreation facility and be retained in such use in perpetuity unless otherwise provided and agreed to by the City, the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation, and any affected federal agency.

Section 6. This resolution shall become part of the formal application to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation.

Section 7. Adequate notification has been given and an opportunity provided for public input into the proposed project and published notices have identified affected flood plains and/or wetlands, if applicable.
