Revised Fire Dept User Fee:

RESOLUTION NO. 909

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON, AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 793 BY ADDING TO THE SCHEDULE OF "USER FEES", THE FEES FOR VARIOUS FIRE DEPARTMENT SERVICES.

WHEREAS, Section 1 of Resolution No. 793 passed by the City Council on April 4, 1989, established a schedule of "user fees", including penalties, administrative charges, permit fees, etc., and

WHEREAS, the City Council, upon recommendation of the Fire Chief, has determined that this schedule of "user fees" should be amended to include fees for various fire department services, NOW, THEREFORE,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON, HEREBY RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Fire Department Fee Schedule. The fees, administrative charges, and costs set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein in full by this reference shall be added to the schedule of "user fees" incorporated within Resolution No. 793.

Section 2. Inflation Adjustment. Any fees, administrative charges, and costs set forth in Exhibit A shall be reviewed annually by the Fire Chief in order to determine whether the same are adequate to cover the Department's costs providing the

services for which the fee, charge or cost is collected. If, after such review, the Chief determines that the City's costs are not adequately covered, the Chief may either:

- Administratively increase the amount of the fee, charge or cost in order to cover the Department's costs for providing the service, provided, that the increase shall not exceed the most recently published Consumer Price Index-Wage Earners Clerical Workers for the Seattle-Tacoma area as published by the U. S. Department Labor-Bureau of Labor Statistics; or
- If any increase greater than the CPI is necessary to cover the Department's costs, the Chief shall submit the increase to the City Council for approval.

Section 3. Effective Date. The effective date of the fees adopted by this resolution shall be September 15 , 1992.

FIRE DEPARTMENT FEE SCHEDULE

Increase the fee to \$130 for both tenant improvement and new systems. Fees are based on an hourly labor rate of \$37/hour.

New Construction and Tenant Improvement Permit Fees Change the fee structure to increase fees for smaller projects and reduce fees for larger projects. The fee structure would be:

\$100,000 to \$500,000	\$280
\$500,000 to \$1M	\$435
\$1M and up	\$435

plus \$.10 per 1,000

The fee for a \$250,000 project would be \$280.

Arson or Negligence Incidents

Institute a composite hourly fee of \$45 per hour for labor and overhead costs. Institute an hourly fee for equipment in accordance with the vehicle equipment hourly cost schedule. Authorize a charge based on replacement cost for any apparatus or equipment contaminated, destroyed, or lost while providing service. Authorize a charge based on cost for special items or supplies used for responding to a particular incident.

However, in a criminal action, pursuant to RCW 9.94A.140, any restitution shall not exceed twice the amount of gain by the defendant or loss of the victim. This also may be collected as "cost" for criminal prosecution.

Aid Standby

Institute an hourly fee for labor based on the overtime hourly rate of \$52. Institute an hourly fee for equipment in accordance with the vehicle equipment hourly cost schedule. No fee would be charged for events sponsored in whole or in part by the city of Redmond.

Special Service - Hazardous Waste and Other Cleanup

Institute a composite hourly fee of \$45/per hour for labor and overhead costs. Institute an hourly fee for equipment in accordance with the vehicle equipment hourly cost schedule.

Authorize a charge based on replacement cost for any apparatus or equipment contaminated, destroyed, or lost while providing service. Authorize a charge based on cost for special items or supplies used for responding to a particular incident (including the cleanup of hazardous waste or similar incidents).

CPR Course

Institute a fee to recover the full cost of providing service. This fee would be in addition to the registration fee charged by Parks and Recreation.

Senior Citizen (55 + years) \$4.00 residing in the city of Redmond or King County Fire District 34

Citizens residing in or employed \$10.00 in, or employed by a company located in, the city of Redmond or King County Fire District 34

Citizens not falling into the above two categories.

All fees shall be adjusted annually for inflation based upon the Consumer Price Index for the Seattle/Tacoma area for the first half of the prior year.
