RESOLUTION NO. 940

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE  
CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON AUTHORIZING  
APPLICATION TO KING COUNTY FOR THE 1993  
REGIONAL CONSERVATION FUTURES  
ACQUISITION PROGRAM FOR OPEN SPACE  
PROJECTS OF EXTRAORDINARY LOCAL  
SIGNIFICANCE FOR SUBURBAN CITIES. (EAST  
LAKE SAMMAMISH WATERFRONT PARK)

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Redmond has included the East Lake Sammamish Waterfront Park in Redmond's C.I.P. since the C.I.P. was developed and in the PROPLAN since 1989 and has on several occasions attempted to raise funds for acquisition of the Park, and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of the Regional Conservation Futures 1993 Bond Acquisition Program, Ordinance 10750, funding assistance has been authorized and made available in the 1993 King County Regional Conservation Futures Acquisition Program to aid in financing the cost of land for open space which has extraordinary local significance for suburban projects, and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Redmond considers it in the best public interest to acquire approximately approximately 1400 linear feet of shoreline (1.28 acres) along East Lake Sammamish for a regional park, now, therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND,  
WASHINGTON HEREBY RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized to make formal application to the 1993 King County Regional Conservation Futures Acquisition Program for funding assistance in connection with the acquisition of approximately 1400 linear feet of shoreline (1.28 acres) of open space along East Lake Sammamish.

Section 2. Any funding assistance received as the result of this application shall be used in the acquisition of approximately 1400 linear feet of shoreline (1.28 acres) of open space along East Lake Sammamish.


Section 3. Any property acquired with financial aid through the 1993 King County Regional Conservation Futures Acquisition Program shall be placed in use as open space and be retained in such use in perpetuity unless otherwise provided and agreed to by the City of Redmond, the King County Open Space Citizens Oversight Committee, and any affected federal, state, and county agencies.

Section 4. This resolution shall become part of the formal application to the 1993 King County Regional Conservation Futures Acquisition Program.

Section 5. Adequate notification has been given and an opportunity provided for public input into the proposed project and published notices have identified affected flood plains and/or wetlands, if applicable.
