RESOLUTION NO. 948

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE  
CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON AUTHORIZING  
APPLICATION TO THE METRO REGIONAL  
SHORELINE IMPROVEMENT FUND FOR THE OPEN  
SPACE CORRIDOR WITH MULTIPLE-USE TRAIL  
FOLLOWING BEAR CREEK

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Redmond  
has approved a "Comprehensive Park and Recreation Plan" for  
the urban area which identifies an open space corridor with  
a multiple-use trail following Bear Creek in the  
northeastern part of the City and

WHEREAS, METRO has set aside a \$5 million dollar  
fund for shoreline acquisition or improvements in the Metro  
service area, and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Redmond  
considers it in the best public interest to acquire an open  
space corridor with multiple-use trail in the northeastern  
part of the city generally located along Bear Creek, south  
of Novelty Hill Road, and bordering on the eastern city  
limits, now, therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND,  
WASHINGTON HEREBY RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized to make  
formal application to Metro for funding assistance in  
connection with the acquisition of an open space corridor

with multiple-use trail following Bear Creek in the northeastern part of the City.

Section 2. Any funding assistance received as the result of this application shall be used in the acquisition of land in the northeastern part of the City of Redmond to create the open space corridor with multiple-use trail identified in the "Comprehensive Park and Recreation Plan."

Section 3. The City's share of the project will be derived from the 1989 Park Bond and Interagency for Outdoor Recreation (I.A.C.) grant monies received.

Section 4. The City of Redmond hereby certifies that the City is responsible to support all non-cash commitments to the local share should they not materialize.

Section 5. Any property acquired with financial aid through the Metro Regional Shoreline Improvement Fund shall be placed in use as an open space corridor with multiple-use trail and be retained in such use in perpetuity unless otherwise provided and agreed to by the City of Redmond, Metro, King County, and any affected federal, state, and county agencies.

Section 6. This resolution shall become part of the formal application to the Metro Shoreline Improvement Fund.

Section 7. Adequate notification has been given and an opportunity provided for public input into the proposed project and published notices have identified affected flood plains and/or wetlands, if applicable.
