

RESOLUTION NO. 970

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON AUTHORIZING APPLICATION FOR FUNDING ASSISTANCE FOR THE EAST LAKE SAMMAMISH WATERFRONT PARK PROJECT TO THE INTERAGENCY COMMITTEE FOR OUTDOOR RECREATION AS PROVIDED BY THE WASHINGTON WILDLIFE RECREATION PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Redmond, Washington has included the East Lake Sammamish Waterfront Park in Redmond's "Comprehensive Park and Recreation Plan" since the C.I.P. was developed and in the PRO Plan since 1989 and has on several occasions attempted to raise funds for acquisition of the Park; and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of the Washington Wildlife Recreation Program, state and federal funding assistance has been authorized and made available to aid in financing the cost of land for parks and habitat conservation areas and the construction of outdoor recreational facilities of local public bodies; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Redmond considers it in the best public interest to acquire land on the east shoreline of Lake Sammamish; now therefore  
THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON HEREBY  
RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized to make formal application to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation for funding assistance.

Section 2. Any funding assistance received as the result of this application shall be used in the acquisition of approximately 1000 linear feet of shoreline (approximately 1.8 acres) of open space along East Lake Sammamish.

Section 3. That the City of Redmond's monetary share of the project will be derived from 1993 Conservation Futures Tax Fund for Properties of Local Significance for Suburban Cities.


Section 4. That any property acquired with financial aid through the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation be placed in use as an outdoor recreation facility or habitat conservation area and be retained in such use in perpetuity unless as otherwise provided and agreed to by the City Council, the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation, and any affected federal agency.

Section 5. That this Resolution become part of a formal application to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation.

Section 6. That adequate notification has been given and the opportunity provided for public input and that published notices have identified affected flood plains and/or wetlands, if applicable.
