RESOLUTION NO. 980

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON AUTHORIZING APPLICATION TO THE WASHINGTON STATE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES AND THE DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND WILDLIFE REGARDING FUNDING ASSISTANCE FOR MACKEY CREEK STREAM AND HABITAT RESTORATION AT FARREL-McWHIRTER PARK

WHEREAS, the City of Redmond owns Farrel-McWhirter Park, located at Section 31, T26N, R6E on Redmond Road N.E. and

WHEREAS, in 1989 the City Council approved the Park Renovation Bond Issue to improve Mackey Creek where it flows through Farrel-McWhirter Park. In 1990, \$44,000 was allocated toward the project, and

WHEREAS, in 1990 Consultants were commissioned to provide design work and to prepare detailed construction plans and specification, and

WHEREAS, in 1990 Phase I of Mackey Creek restoration was completed; Phase II and Phase III were not completed as there were insufficient funds, and

WHEREAS, the Department of Natural Resources and the Department of Fish and Wildlife has been authorized by the 1994 State Legislature to offer \$4.5 million to be used in watershed restoration; each application project may be funded up to \$500,000, and

WHEREAS, the Redmond Parks Department intends to request \$250,000 for Phase II and III of the Mackey Creek restoration project, now therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON  
HEREBY RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized to make formal application to the 1994-1995 Watershed Restoration Partnership Program through the Department of Natural Resources and the Department of Fish and Wildlife for funding assistance.

Section 2. Any funding assistance received as the result of this application shall be used in the restoration of Mackey Creek where it flows through Farrel-McWhirter Park.

Section 3. The City of Redmond hereby certifies that the City is responsible to support all non-cash commitments to the local share should they not materialize.

Section 4. This resolution shall become part of the formal application to the 1994-1995 Watershed Restoration Partnership Program.

Section 5. Adequate notification has been given and an opportunity provided for public input into the proposed project and published notices have identified affected flood plains and/or wetlands, if applicable.
