Ordinance No. 108

An ordinance declaring an emergency and appropriating not to exceed \$2100.00 from the Current Expense Fund for the purchase of a tract of land for Fire Hall and Town Hall purposes, such appropriation to be taken out of the Betterment item in the Budget for 1948.

Whereas, the present building and lot in which the Town fire fighting apparatus is stored has become inadequate, and it becomes necessary to provide larger grounds and a larger building to store said apparatus and also to provide a site on which to erect a Town Hall and

Whereas Leo B. Reed has offered to sell to the Town of Redmond the following described tract of land for the sum of \$2100.00

Now, therefore be it ordained by the Town Council of the Town of Redmond as follows:

Section 1. That an emergency exists, making it necessary for the Town to acquire additional land to be used for the above named purposes.

Section 2. That there is hereby appropriated for said purpose a sum not to exceed \$2100.00 from the Betterment item in the Current Expense Fund, Budgeted for 1948, to purchase said tract of land from Leo B. Reed, described as follows:

That portion of the Northwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of Section Twelve (12) Township Twenty Five (25) North, Range Five (5) East, W.M. described as follows:

Beginning on the North line of Faulds Road (Jackson Street) at a point 318.00 feet South and 305.63 feet East of the Northwest corner of said subdivision; thence East along said North line 122.00 feet; thence North 144.00 feet; thence West 40.00 feet; thence North 19.00 feet; thence West 82.00 feet; thence South 163.00 feet to the point of beginning.

Introduced on Feb. 18 - 48 by F.W. Buckler at a regular meeting passed its first reading.

Passed its second reading on March 3. 48 and passed by unanimous vote of the councilmen present, at a regular meeting.
