

ORDINANCE NO. 1093

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON, CREATING A NEW CHAPTER 9.36 OF THE REDMOND MUNICIPAL CODE BY PROHIBITING THE DROPPING OR TRACKING OF MATERIALS ONTO ROADWAYS AND REQUIRING SECURITY FOR THE PAYMENT OF COSTS OF ROADWAY CLEAN-UP.

WHEREAS, construction, excavation, sand and gravel hauling and other activities within the City result in the deposit of materials onto roadways which creates a hazard to traffic and necessitates the expenditure of public funds to clean up said roadways, now, therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Redmond Municipal Code is hereby amended by adding a new Chapter 9.36 entitled Regulation of Debris on Roadways to read as follows:

9.36.000 REGULATION OF DEBRIS ON ROADWAYS

9.36.010 Deposit of Debris Prohibited--Cash Deposit for Cleanup. No person, firm or corporation shall engage in any excavating, filling, grading, construction, hauling, or other activity either as part of an ongoing business or in connection with temporary construction or excavation activity, when such activity either does, or is likely to contribute to the deposit of dirt, mud, rock, debris or other material of any nature on any public right-of-way by virtue of vehicular traffic or from any other cause except under the following conditions:

- A. A cash deposit in an amount established by the Director of the Department of Public Works, but in no event less than two hundred fifty dollars, shall be deposited with the City to be held in trust to cover the costs of any necessary maintenance, repairs or cleanup in the event of the failure of any person, firm or corporation causing any dirt, mud, rocks or other debris or materials to be deposited on any public right-of-way, to promptly remove the same. These funds or the balance thereof shall be refunded upon completion of the activity if such activity is of a temporary nature.
- B. Every person, firm or corporation engaged in any activity identified in this Section shall have equipment available during the course of each day's operation to insure a speedy and

timely removal of any rock, mud, dirt or other debris or material deposited on the public right-of-way. The equipment shall include a power broom or other similar equipment approved by the Director of Public Works. The right-of-way surfaces shall be cleaned prior to the end of each day's operation and, in addition, all catchbasins, culverts or other municipally owned improvements affected by the deposit of mud, dirt, rocks, debris or other material shall also be cleaned.

9.36.020 Cash Deposit As Prerequisite to Issuance of Permits. No building, clearing and grading permit or business license shall be issued for any activity or business for which provision of cash deposit has been required pursuant to Section 9.36.010 until such cash deposit has been provided.

9.36.030 Stop Work Order. In the event any person, firm or corporation fails to comply with the provisions of this chapter, the City Engineer or his designee may cause a notice of violation to be delivered to a person of suitable age at the job site and may order all work to cease until authorized to proceed. Failure to comply with the order to stop work shall be a separate offense punishable as provided in Section 1.01.110 of the Redmond Municipal Code.

9.36.300 Penalty for Violations. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this Chapter is guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished as provided in Section 1.01.110 of the Redmond Municipal Code.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect thirty (30) days after passage and publication by posting as provided by law.


