

ORDINANCE NO. 1108

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON, AMENDING SECTIONS 2.16.010 AND 2.16.120 OF THE REDMOND MUNICIPAL CODE TO INCREASE THE NUMBER OF MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF PARK COMMISSIONERS FROM FIVE TO SEVEN; ESTABLISHING THE INITIAL TERMS OF OFFICE FOR THE NEWLY CREATED POSITIONS; AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

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THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON,  
DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 2.16.010 of the Redmond Municipal Code is hereby amended to expand the number of commissioners on the Board of Park Commissioners from five to seven to read as follows:

2.16.010 Established--Qualifications of Members. A Board of Park Commissioners is created and established within the City. It shall consist of seven members, who shall be appointed by the Mayor, subject to confirmation by a majority vote of the City Council, all of whom shall be residents of the City at the time of their appointments and during their tenures of office. Appointments shall be made from citizens of recognized fitness for the position and shall be selected without respect to political affiliations, race or sex. Members shall serve without salary or other compensation; except that they may be reimbursed from Park Department funds for necessary expenses actually incurred. The Board of Park Commissioners may be known as the Redmond Park Board.

Section 2. Section 2.16.020 of the Redmond Municipal Code is hereby amended to establish the term of office for members of the Board of Park Commissioners including the two newly created positions to read as follows:

2.16.020 Term of Office--Vacancies--Removal. The members of the Board of Park Commissioners shall hold office for a term of three years, commencing on the first day of January. The five existing commissioners as of the date of the amendment to this section shall continue to serve for the balance of their respective terms. The two additional commissioners authorized by the amendment to Section 2.16.010 increasing the number of members from five to seven shall be appointed for an initial term, one of which shall expire January 1, 1984, and one of which shall expire January 1, 1986. Thereafter, as each term expires, appointments shall be made for a three year term. Vacancies occurring otherwise than through the expiration of a term shall be filled for the


unexpired term by appointment of the Mayor as provided in Section 2.16.010. Members may be removed, after a public hearing, by the Mayor with the approval of the City Council, for inefficiency, neglect of duty, misfeasance or malfeasance in office, or incapacity.

Section 3. This ordinance, being an exercise of a power specifically delegated to the City legislative body, is not subject to referendum, and shall take effect five (5) days after its passage and publication by posting as provided by law, provided, however, the existing Board, consisting of five members at the time of passage of this ordinance shall continue to constitute the entire Board until such time as both of the newly created positions have been filled by appointment by the Mayor and confirmed by the City Council.


