

ORDINANCE No 115

An ordinance establishing rules and regulations for the construction and installation, alteration and repair of plumbing and drainage in the Town of Redmond.

Be it ordained by the Council of the Town of Redmond as follows:

Section 1, The Town of Redmond by this ordinance adopts the King County Plumbing Code No. 9826 as the Code for the Town of Redmond, with the following alterations, additions or deletions.

Section 2, In Article 2, Section 1 the following is to be added:
Nothing in this ordinance will be construed to prevent an owner from doing plumbing work on his own property, or employing others to do said work, provided said work complies with the provisions of said code.

Section 3, In Article 2, Section 3 the following alteration is to appear
No plumbing or drainage work for which a permit is required within the Town of Redmond, shall be started without a permit having been secured from the Building Department, said permit to cost the grantee the sum of Fifty Cents (.50) per fixture.

Section 4. In Article 5, Section 10 shall read as follows:
No water closet shall discharge into a pipe less than (4) Four inches in diameter. There shall be a lead connection at least (12) twelve inches in length between the closet bowl and soil pipe, or a lead bend of (3) grade (6) pound lead. Wall toilets are permissible in public buildings by making all waste connections of soil pipe, using a lead stub or bend wiped on brass ferrule, or by using a (4) four inch nipple from fitting to cast screw flange.
No branch of waste from any fixture with hot water shall enter lead bend.

Section 5. In Article 5, Section 27 the words Building Inspector shall be substituted for the words, Chief Sanitarian.

Introduced on April 21st 1948, passed its first reading.
