

ORDINANCE NO. 127

AN ORDINANCE declaring a public emergency, transferring \$10,300.00 from the "Current Expense Fund" to the "Town Hall and Fire Hall Building Fund."

WHEREAS the Town Council of the Town of Redmond has been authorized to construct a combination Town Hall and Fire Hall by Ordinance No. 117, duly enacted on July 21st, 1948, and construction thereof has been commenced; and

WHEREAS the budgeted funds available to defray the part of the cost of such construction over and above the sums to be raised by the sale of a bond issue voted upon by the qualified electors of the Town of Redmond at a special election on September 14th, 1948, and other funds are now found to be inadequate, and

WHEREAS, the foregoing facts constituting the public emergency could not reasonably have been foreseen at the time of making the Town's estimate and budget for the year, 1949, and

WHEREAS, there has been placed in the Current Expense Fund the sum of \$10,300.00, said sum having been derived from the sale of the Gun Club Contract to E. O. Lentz,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF REDMOND:

Section 1. That a public emergency exists in the Town of Redmond.

Section 2. That the sum of \$10,300.00 derived from the sale of the Gun Club Contract to E. O. Lentz is hereby transferred to the "Town Hall and Fire Hall Building Fund", from the "Current Expense Fund", to be used in the construction of the combination Town Hall and Fire Hall.
