ORDINANCE NO. 1293

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON, AMENDING THE REDMOND MUNICIPAL CODE TO REVISE THE DATES OF APPOINTMENT FOR MEMBERS OF THE CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION, PARKS BOARD, DISABILITY BOARD, LIBRARY BOARD AND PLANNING COMMISSION.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Redmond, Washington, has determined that the terms of office of citizen advisory boards and commissions should commence April 1 rather than January 1 to avoid the inconvenience of conducting the interviewing, appointment and confirmation process during the holiday season, now, therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON, DO
ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 2.12.010 of the Redmond Municipal Code, "Civil Service Commission Created, Appointment, Terms, Removal and Quorum," is hereby amended to read as follows and divided into separate new sections which are hereby added to the Redmond Municipal Code as follows:

2.12.010 Civil Service Commission Created - Appointment.

A Civil Service Commission is hereby established. The Commission shall consist of three people appointed by the Mayor to serve without compensation as members of the Commission.

2.12.012 Qualifications - Removal. No person shall be appointed a member of such commission who is not a citizen of the United States, a resident of such city for at least three years immediately preceding such appointment, and an elector of the county wherein he resides. No confirmation of the appointment or appointments of members of the commission by any legislative body shall be required. Any member of the commission may be removed from office for incompetency, incompatibility or dereliction of duty, or malfeasance in office, or other good cause; provided, however, that no member of the commission shall be removed until charges have been preferred, in writing, due notice and a full hearing had. The members of such commission shall devote due time and attention to the performance of the duties hereinafter specified and imposed upon them by this chapter.

2.12.014 Terms of Office. Members shall hold office for a term of six years. Members whose present terms expire on December 31 shall serve

until March 31 and all successive terms shall commence on April 1. Each member shall hold office until a successor is appointed and takes the oath of office.

2.12.016 Quorum. Two members shall constitute a quorum and the votes of any two members concurring shall be sufficient for the decision of all matters and the transaction of all business to be decided or transacted by the commission under or by virtue of the provisions of this chapter.

Section 2. Section 2.16.020 of the Redmond Municipal Code, "Term of Office - Vacancies - Removal," is hereby amended to read as follows:

2.16.020 Term of Office - Vacancies - Removal. The members of the board of parks commissioners shall hold office for a term of three years. Members whose present terms expire on December 31 shall serve until March 31 and all successive terms shall commence on April 1. As each term expires, appointments shall be made for a three year term. Vacancies occurring otherwise than through the expiration of a term shall be filled for the unexpired term by appointment of the Mayor as provided in Section 2.16.010. Members may be removed, after a public hearing, by the mayor with the approval of the city council, for inefficiency, neglect of duty, misfeasance or malfeasance in office, or incapacity. Each member shall hold office until a successor is appointed and confirmed.

Section 3. Section 2.28.020 of the Redmond Municipal Code, "Terms - Vacancies," is hereby amended to read as follows:

2.28.020 Terms - Vacancies. All members of the Redmond Disability Board shall serve for a two-year term; provided, that for first terms, the law enforcement officer elected shall serve for a one-year term as designated by the mayor, and all other appointees shall serve two-year terms. First terms shall commence as of November 1, 1979. Members whose present terms expire on December 31 shall serve until March 31 and all successive terms shall commence on April 1. Vacancies shall be filled by appointment for the unexpired term of the member whose death, resignation or removal creates the vacancy. Each member shall hold office until a successor is appointed and confirmed.

Section 4. Section 2.56.020 of the Redmond Municipal Code, "Term of Office - Vacancies - Removal," is hereby amended to read as follows:

2.56.020 Term of Office - Vacancies - Removal. The members of the Library Board of Trustees shall hold office for a term of five years, except that the first appointments shall be for terms of one, two, three, four and five years, respectively, as determined by the appointing authority. Thereafter, as each term expires, appointments shall be made for a five-year term. Members whose present terms expire on December 31 shall serve until

March 31 and all successive terms shall commence on April 1. No person shall be appointed for more than two consecutive terms. Each member shall hold office until a successor is appointed and confirmed.

Section 5. Section 20F.10.090(30) of the Redmond Municipal Code and Community Development Guide, "Term of Office," is hereby amended to read as follows:

The regular term of office for Commission positions shall be for four (4) years. Initial terms shall be staggered with two members appointed for two years, two members appointed for three years, and three members for four years. Members whose present terms expire on December 31 shall serve until March 31 and all successive terms shall commence on April 1. No member shall serve more than two consecutive terms. Each member shall hold office until a successor is appointed and confirmed.

Section 6. If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance should be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance.

Section 7. This ordinance, being an exercise of a power specifically delegated to the City legislative body, is not subject to referendum, and shall take effect five (5) days after its publication or publication of a summary thereof in the City's official newspaper.


