

Ordinance No. 138

An Ordinance, Declaring an Emergency and Transferring \$1000<sup>00</sup>  
from the Current Expense Fund to the Town Hall and Fire Hall  
Building fund.

Whereas, the Town Council of the Town of Redmond has been authorized to construct a combination Town Hall and Fire Hall by ordinance No. 117 duly enacted on July 21st 1948, and construction thereof has progressed, and

Whereas, the budgeted funds available to defray the part of the cost of such construction over and above the sums to be raised by the sale of a bond issue voted by the qualified electors of the Town of Redmond at a special election on September 14th, 1948, and other funds, are now found to be inadequate, and

Whereas, the foregoing facts constituting the public emergency could not reasonably have been foreseen at the time of making the Town's estimate and budget for the year of 1950, and

Whereas, there will be needed a sum of \$1000<sup>00</sup> to finish the construction of said Town Hall and Fire Hall,

Now, therefore be it ordained by the Town Council of the Town of Redmond,

Section 1, That a public emergency exists in the Town of Redmond.

Section 2, That there is hereby transferred to the Town Hall and Fire Hall building Fund from the Current Expense Fund the sum of

\$1000<sup>00</sup> to be used to finish the construction of said Town Hall and Fire Hall.

Introduced on April 26th by A. H. Buckley  
and passed its first reading.

Passed its second reading and adopted on May 10 - 1950
