ORDINANCE NO. 1501

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON,  
ESTABLISHING REDMOND MUNICIPAL CODE AND COMMUNITY  
DEVELOPMENT GUIDE SECTION 20B.70.100 WHICH  
APPROVES THE SOUTHEAST REDMOND WATER SYSTEM PLAN.

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WHEREAS, the City Council recognizes the need to  
improve water service for the area in Redmond south and east of  
Bear Creek, and

WHEREAS, the City Planning Commission, in order to  
consider public testimony on a plan to improve this water  
service, has held a public hearing and reviewed the Southeast  
Redmond Water System Plan prepared by David Evans and Associates,  
Inc. and dated November 8, 1988, and the City of Redmond 300 Zone  
Booster Pump Station Preliminary Design Report prepared by RH2  
Engineering and dated April 19, 1989, and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission recommends that the  
City Council adopt and approve these plans as the Southeast  
Redmond Water System Plan, now, therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON,  
HEREBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Approval of Southeast Redmond Water System  
Plan. A new section 20B.70.100 is hereby added to the Redmond  
Municipal Code and Community Development Guide to read as  
follows:

20B.70.100 Southeast Redmond Water System Plan

The Southeast Redmond Water System Plan  
prepared by David Evans and Associates, Inc.  
dated November 8, 1988, identifies proposed  
water system improvements including a major  
booster pump station, a storage tank, and  
transmission-distribution mains for an area of  
the City generally enclosed by Union Hill Road  
on the north, 196th Avenue on the east,  
Redmond-Fall City Road on the south, and  
Avondale Road on the west. The City of  
Redmond 300 Zone Booster Pump Station  
Preliminary Design Report prepared by RH2  
Engineering dated April 19, 1989, identifies  
additional alternatives and develops in more  
detail some of the specific facilities  
recommended in the Water System Plan. The  
recommended improvements within these two  
reports are hereby incorporated into the  
City's Water Facilities Plan.

Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance, being an exercise of a power specifically delegated to the City legislative body, is not subject to referendum, and shall take effect five (5) days after passage and publication of the attached summary which is hereby approved.
